#### A Note from the Vicar

"This is what GoD says, the God who builds a road right through the ocean, who carves a path through pounding waves, The God who summons horses and chariots and armies—they lie down and then can't get up; they're snuffed out like so many candles: "Forget about what's happened; don't keep going over old history. Be alert, be present. I'm about to do something brand-new. It's bursting out! Don't you see it? There it is! I'm making a road through the desert, rivers in the badlands. Wild animals will say 'Thank you!' —the coyotes and the buzzards— Because I provided water in the desert, rivers through the sunbaked earth, drinking water for the people I chose, the people I made especially for myself, a people custom-made to praise me. (Isaiah 43:16-21 The Message)

The year ends, and another begins. It is that time when we find ourselves reflecting on and re-establishing our goals, priorities, and habits in hope of positive results. The words of Isaiah 43 serve as encouragement as we live into being members of the family of faith. Doing the work God has called us to do.

We must *be alert, be present*, recognizing God is about to do something *brand-new*. New is scary. It causes anxiety, fear, defensiveness, and requires work. However, when we surrender our selfish desires and admit that God is fully in control, it becomes easy to see His faithfulness to us. God chose us, He made us especially for himself. Holding onto *what has happened* and *going over old history* is selfish and hinders us from experiencing the fullness of God's plan. Why would anyone want that?

We are a people custom-made to praise God. As we continue learning together, let us recognize each day, where we see God at work in ourselves, our homes, in His church, and in our community. Let our daily recognition be a form of praise to the God who is guiding and leading us to a deeper understanding of the *new* work He is calling us toward.

Faith, love, grace, mercy, and peace be with you.

# **Shared Ministry Committee**

# The committee was formed in November 2023 when we agreed to have a shared pastoral leadership agreement with another congregation, that being BULC.

- a) The committee consists of four members from both congregations (8 total) with each member serving for 2 years. Current 2024 Jerusalem committee members are Dave Carson, J D Wissler, Kathy Schreiber and Jean Slaymaker as chair. Also, Vicar Phil and acting Council Presidents attend the Committee's meetings.
- b) Our first order of business as a Committee was the creation and signature of "Articles of Agreement" which defines the shared relationship with the pastoral leader and both congregations of Jerusalem & BULC. This was completed and signed in January 2024
- c) Spring of 2024 the TEEM vicar program was introduced by Synod to the Committee and both councils, which eventually lead to Vicar Phil's appointment to serve the two congregations.
- d) Now that Vicar Phil is here, this is a good time to remind everyone what the Shared Ministry Committee responsibilities are as we work with our councils and other committees:
- 1. The Share Ministry Committee oversees all aspects of the Vicar Phil's role in our congregations (in a "standard pastoral call" this would fall to the Call Committee). So, if there is any positive feedback or concerns that you want to share, please first share with Vicar Phil directly. If there is an issue that cannot be resolved, we then ask that you first bring it to someone on the Shared Ministry committee.
- 2. This committee will coordinate worship services and program calendars that impact both congregations. In these situations, we will coordinate with other committees as appropriate (i.e., Music and Worship). (For example, this is how we planned the advent services and the Christmas Eve service date and times). This committee also recommended the worship times for both congregations that meet the mutual needs of our shared relationship).
- 3. The committee also has responsibility for the working/business relationship between both congregations working with our Treasurers and Finance Committees (for example, Vicar Phil's payroll, benefits, expenses, etc).
- 4. So, please remember to seek us out when you have feedback regarding Vicar Phil or anything related to our shared ministry.
- e) Also, we will be looking for 2 new Shared Ministry Committee members for 2025. If you would be willing to serve on this committee that will meet every other month and eventually quarterly in the future, please contact Jean Slaymaker.

**Additional Note:** The Shared Ministry Committee requests that we remember that Vicar Phil is new in his position and is still learning. During his availability hours, if his office door is open please come in. If his office door is closed, it is closed for a reason. If you really want or need to meet with Vicar Phil, it may be wise to call first.

## FEBRUARY CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

At our February Congregational meeting we will be electing a new 2025 nominating committee. The current members are Joyce Burkholder, Brenda Fetter, Zachary Fetter and Larrie Miller and they are ineligible for 2025. Beth Smith has three CD's that will be renewed; the copier contract was discussed; \$1735 has been raised so far for hurricane relief. Patti Stripling made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report subject to audit; Jill Clubb seconded the motion; the motion passed.

The proposed 2025 Budget was submitted to Council- see new business.

**Vicar's Report:** the Vicar's Report was distributed and discussed. The Vicar will be on vacation from 12/12 through 12/17, Pastor Dana Blouch-Hansen to supply on 12/15.

### **Old Business:**

1. No one has come forward to fill the four empty council seats. Several members have been asked but have responded "no" or "maybe". Vicar Philip has asked five members to respond to him no later than 11/18. Vicar Philip has asked synod what would happen if we are unable to seat an eightmember council per our Constitution: if we can not meet our constitutional requirement of an 8-member council, the Synod would step in and do a

review and viability study of our congregation.

- 2. Trash collection update: proposals from several carriers were presented and discussed, a decision on a trash service for 2025 will be made at the December council meeting.
- 3. Constitution Update: synod still has not reviewed our proposed Constitution updates. Vicar Philip will resubmit our updates.

#### **New Business:**

- 1. Proposed 2025 Budget: the proposed 2025 Budget was distributed by Larrie Miller from the Finance Committee and discussed. Vicar Philip Supeck stated that the Vicar's Salary(Line 108) needed to be adjusted to account for a salary increase in August 2025. The related taxes and allowances(Lines 109-114) will also have to be adjusted. Discussion also took place regarding the Zoom contract (Line 49). Staff salaries were also discussed. Also discussed was that, in the future, the Mutual Ministry should recommend staff salary increases. Vicar Philip Supeck made a motion to increase the staff salaries by 2.5%; Joyce Burkholder seconded the motion; the motion passed. Patti Stripling made a motion to accept the proposed 2025 with adjustments to the Vicar's salary, staff salaries and the Zoom contract; the motion was seconded by Rene Amey; the motion passed.
- 2. Christmas Caroling and Church Decorating: proposed caroling at Luther Acres and Pleasant View. Church decorating- December 1<sup>st</sup> before service
- 3. Discussed possible change to council meeting night to accommodate potential new council members
- 4. Christmas Eve Social: Brenda Fetter to organize this event
- 5. Inclement weather protocol: discussed. If inclement weather is forecast the respective council presidents will speak on Saturday and make a determination if the Sunday services should be cancelled by 6:00 pm Saturday evening


